Muskegon Woman's Club

The Muskegon Woman's Club was founded in 1890, and dedicated to the intellectual "improvement and development" of women. The Chicago firm of Weir and Perry designed this Neoclassical structure, built in 1902 with funds donated by Minnie Smith, the widow of Muskegon attorney Francis Smith. The club lobbied to hire the first police woman, held performances, and worked with charitable groups such as the Red Cross and the Council of National Defense.

For more than 120 years, members of the Greater Muskegon Woman’s Club have quietly made the community a better and safer place to live and work. They are mothers, daughters, wives, grandmothers, sisters, aunts, cousins, friends, colleagues, etc.

The Greater Muskegon Woman’s Club is a center dedicated to celebrating noble and honorable pursuits by Muskegon area women.

The clubhouse is now the permanent home for the Muskegon County Women of Achievement Hall of Fame and Women’s History/Vision Museum. In 2000, it was also registered as a Michigan Historic Site.

Both the Hall of Fame and the History/Vision Museum were dedicated during Women’s History Month, which is celebrated nationally during March each year.

The Greater Muskegon Woman’s Club is committed to educating the public about the important things women have accomplished for the good of this community.

MEMORIAL/TRIBUTE PAVER

The mission of our Hall of Fame program is “to honor in perpetuity those women whose contributions to the arts, education, business, athletics, government, the humanities, science and philanthropy have greatly enhanced and improved Muskegon County.”

With the establishment of this new paver program, we now broaden the opportunity to honor and invite you to celebrate women dear to you by purchasing a paver in that person’s name. The memorials will be placed in the terrace across the entire front of the clubhouse, between the foundation and the public sidewalk.

We invite you to view the rendering of the site (available inside the building). The “paver garden” will be beautiful and meaningful.

Funds raised through the sale of pavers will be used to continually educate and promote women’s activities in Muskegon County.
